## FSN SERVICES FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

FSN's youth work has focused primarily in Bexhill and Rother, supporting young people who would not otherwise have access to a safe space and activities that meet their needs.

### **Bexhill Youth Project**

As well as the delivery of youth sessions, FSN offers the opportunity for young people to gain accredited AQA modules such as cooking, fundraising, event volunteering, teamwork and building social skills.

In October 2024, the young people organised an awards ceremony to celebrate their success, including 91 awards achieved in the last year.

### Youth Voice

A group of young people have worked together to co-design a consultation process for the Rother Youth Strategy. This has included pilot projects in two rural areas of Rother where it had been identified had no youth work taking place. The feedback from the work will be presented to the local Parish Councils and young people and be included in the Youth Strategy for the District.

In 2025, FSN will be celebrating 20 years of its flagship, Dragonflies bereavement project. Since 2005, FSN has supported over 2000 children and young people impacted by the death of a loved one and given guidance to local schools on dealing with grief and suicide.

# FSN YEAR IN FIGURES

- 300 children accessed nursery provision
- 394 referrals to Health Coaches
- 266 young people accessed bereavement and mental health services
- 125 people accessed learning opportunities
- 114 people received dental care through Dentaid
- 214 people were supported by the TA Hub
- 91 AQA certificates were awarded to young people
- 51 families were supported by PACT
- 50 families received support from the Family Support Worker
- 40 families per week accessed the Pantry
- 55 volunteers supported the work of FSN

### Mental Health and Bereavement services

Dragonflies provides a bereavement service which offers support, peer led activity and counselling from 5 years to the age of 18 and My Time offers mental health peer support for children and young people aged 5-16 years

### **Adult Learning**

Delivering Family Learning, Community Learning and Accredited qualifications

### Health and Wellbeing Hubs

Adult peer support activities, personal development courses to support mental health and volunteering opportunities

### **Health Coach**

Working with patients referred by GP surgeries to develop and maintain healthy lifestyles **Pantry** 

Offering food, nappies, hygiene and cleaning products for families

### TA Hub (Temporary Accommodation)

Support for families living in temporary or inappropriate housing in Hastings and Eastbourne **PACT (Parents and Children Together)** 

Peer support group for families with pre-school children with access to play and support **Bexhill Youth Project (BYP) and Youth Voice** 

A safe space for young people aged 11-18 offering a range of activities. The Youth Voice gives young people an opportunity to have their say in shaping FSN services

### Early Years Specialist Family Support Worker

Offering whole family support through home visiting and telephone with advice including; weaning, sleep, child development and parenting

# TREASURER'S REPORT

There was an overall deficit of £101,247 in 2024/2025, this related to Restricted Funding being spent during this year but that had been received in a prior year, in turn the total Restricted Funds reduced from £574,816 to £446,015.

Unrestricted Funds increased from £1,295,967 to £1,323,521. These funds comprise of General Unrestricted and Designated Funds including the Fixed assets of £849,993.

The Restricted Funds are monies that can only be used for specific purposes. Unrestricted General Funds are available for use for all of the Charity's activities. Some of these Unrestricted Funds have been designated for particular purposes where future expenditure is anticipated or could occur.

Our Reserves are encouraging but should not be confused with money in the bank as they primarily represent our assets, being our buildings and equipment totalling £948,620. The balance is working capital and monies in the bank, where in many instances we have received funds for future activities. As a Charity we must receive funds before expenditure is incurred.

FSN remains in a strong financial position and is committed to continuing to meet the changing needs of the Community.
